- 3) Still looking at 17b, where does Paul say he returned to once more? Look at the following Scriptures that reference this place or reference this place with Paul?
 - a) Acts 9:1-22
 - b) Acts 22:1-11
 - c) Acts 26:12-25
 - d) 2Cor. 11:32
 - e) Gal. 1:17
- 4) Looking at Galatians 1:18, how much time has passed and where does Paul go and who does he see and abide with and for how long?
- 5) What do the following say about this person Paul becomes acquainted with? (Note: Although Scripture reveals much more about this man and he also inspired by the Spirit wrote _____, yet this is not relevant to the point Paul is making here in Galatians at his time.)

11)	Are you being (1Tim. 4:6) " <i>constantly</i> nourished on the words of the faith" which (Jud. 1:3) "which was once for all delivered to the saints"?
