3. REVIEW: What was the first vision in 1:7-17 about? What was Zechariah to proclaim and why? What do you think the ultimate message of this vision was?

4. REVIEW: What was the second vision in 1:18-21? What do you think the ultimate message of this vision was?

5. REVIEW: What was the third vision in chapter 2 about? What do you think the ultimate message of this vision was?

6. What does Zachariah see 3:1? From Zechariah, who is "the angel of the Lord"?

7. How do the following help us learn more about Joshua:
