
EBC Study Lesson 17 Zecharíah 9:9

- 2. REVIEW: Concerning 9:1-8 answer the following.
 - a. To whom is this oracle or burden "against" and how do these peoples relate to Israel?
 - b. Describe the attitudes and actions of the nations.
 - c. Do we have any historical data that could point to if what is mentioned in 9:1-7a has happened yet? (Hint: Look at the conquests of Alexander the great)
 - d. In light of what we have learned in Zechariah so far, what timing does 9;7b-8 appear to be speaking of? Could there be a near and far fulfillment? If so, explain
- 3. What are the Jews to do and why (9:9)?
