Lesson 19 Zechariah 9:11-17

As you read and begin this study, ask God to open your heart. As the Psalmist prayed: "Open my eyes, that I may behold Wonderful things from Thy law" (Psalm 119:18).

Assignment: **Read chapters 9-11** several times and attempt to answer the following discussion questions from the text alone.

Questions:

1. REVIEW: Summarize what you learned the following:
 - a. 1:1-6
 - b. 1:7-6:15.
 - c. Chapters 7-8
2. REVIEW: From your last two lessons explain what you learned in 9:1-8
3. REVIEW: What are the Jews to do and why (9:9)? How and when was this prophecy in Zech. 9:9 fulfilled? How do the attitudes and actions of those nations in 9:1-8 differ from Jesus' character manifest in 9:9?
4. REVIEW: Looking at 9:10, what does the Lord say He will do? Explain.
5. REVIEW: Who does the "His" refer to in 9:10 and what did you learn about "His dominion"?
6. Make observations from the following concerning the "you" spoken of in 11:
 - a. 9:9
 - b. 11,12
7. What do you think is being spoken of in 11-12? (Hint: Think of what the Jews just went through). Is there a spiritual application?
8. Why in vs 11 does the Lord say He has "set their prisoners free"?
9. What are the prisoners who were set free to do (vs 12a)? What do you think this means in context?
10. What does the Lord say He is "declaring" "this very day" (12b)? How does that relate to 11-12a?
