EBC Study Lesson 22 Zecharíah 12:1-9

As you read and begin this study, ask God to open your heart. As the Psalmist prayed: "Open my eyes, that I may behold Wonderful things from Thy law" (Psalm 119:18). Assignment: **Read chapters 12-14** and attempt to answer the following discussion questions from the text alone.

Questions:

- 1. REVIEW: Summarize what you learned the following:
 - a. 1:1-6
 - b. 1:7-6:15.
 - c. Chapters 7-8
 - d. Chapters 9-11

Lexical Note: The Hebrew term massa translated "burden" in 9:1 and 12:1 in this context speaks of an oracle or utterance. The word derives its meaning for the verb "to carry," thus giving us the nuance of a burdensome or weighty message.

- 2. Looking at 9:1 and 12:1, what is similar and what is different between how each "burden" is described?
- 3. Looking at 12:1, to whom is this oracle or burden "concerning"? How far does this burden go? I.e. what verse does it end?
- 4. How does the Lord describe Himself in 12:1? See the following verses also: a. Isaiah 44:24, Jer. 51:15
 - b. Psalm 102:25, Hebrews 1:8-12
 - c. Gen 2:7, Acts 17:25, Isaiah 42:5
- 5. After reading chapters 12-14, why do you think the Lord describes Himself this way in 12:1?
- 6. How many times is the phase "in that day" used in Chapter 12, Chapter 13 and Chapter 14?

Interpretive note: The term "cup" speaks of something you drink from. In Scripture this term is sometimes used metaphorically to describe partaking of God's wrath. See Isaiah 51:17, 22, Jer. 25;15, Matt 26:39.

- 7. From 12:2, what does the Lord say He is going to make Jerusalem and who is this towards? What will happen to those? Who else is included with Jerusalem?
- 8. How might the following help us help us understand part of the big picture of what is going on in 12:2-8?
 - a. 12:9
 - b. 14:1-7
 - c. Ezekiel 38, 39:21-29
 - d. Ezekiel 30:2-3
 - e. Zeph. 1:14-18
 - f. Revelation 19:11-21
- Describe what will happen "in that day" from the following:
 a. 12:2-3
 - b. 12:4-5
 - c. 12:6-7
 - d. 12:8
 - e. 12:9
- 10. Summarize from 12:10-14, what will happen also in that day. (We will look at this more in depth next time)
