WHAT DOES GENUINE MINISTRY LOOK LIKE? FROM PAUL'S DEFENSE WE ARE INSTRUCTED AND WARNED 1 Thessalonians 2:1-4

- I. In defense, PAUL FIRST REMINDS THE THESSALONIANS THAT HIS COMING WAS NOT IN VAIN: God's Word proclaimed proved successful in their lives (2:1, 1:2-10, 2:13)
- II. In defense, PAUL REMINDS THEM HOW HE AND HIS COMPANIONS IMPARTED THE WORD...Boldly amid opposition and with pure and proper motives (2-5)
 - A. They spoke the Word courageously amid past and present opposition (2)
 - B. They spoke the Word with pure and proper motives (3-4)
 - 1. They speak the Word **not from error**, **impurity or deceit** (3)
 - 2. They speak the Word **recognizing their stewardship** (4a)
 - 3. Thus, they speak **desiring not to please man but God** who examines their hearts (4b)

- C. Their pure and proper motives were demonstrated to the Thessalonians and witnessed by the Lord (5)
 - 1. They **never spoke words of flattery**, as they knew (5a)
 - 2. They **never spoke the Word as a cloak for covetousness**, as God is witness (5b)
- III. In defense, PAUL REMINDS THEM HOW HE AND HIS COMPANIONS LOVINGLY IMPARTED THEIR LIVES while imparting the Word (6-9)
 - A. As evidenced by the fact **they never sought glory**, exercising weighty apostolic authority (6)
 - **B.** But in contrast, they demonstrated loving gentleness, imparting their lives and laboring so as not to be a burden as they proclaimed the Word, as they knew (7-9)
- IV. In as summary of his defense, PAUL CALLS UPON THE THESSALONIANS AND GOD'S WITNESS AS TO HOW THEY BEHAVED TOWARD THEM (10-12)
