## WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DO THINGS OUR WAY? LEARNING FROM ISAAC AND HIS FAMILY

**Genesis 27:1-46** 

I.	LEARN FROM THESE FOUR EXAMPLES OF SEEKING ONES OWN DESIRE
	RATHER THAN GOD'S (1-29)

- A. Isaac driven by his own desire in contradiction to God's will seeks to secretly bless Esau rather than Isaac and Esau gladly follows along (1-4, 5b, 30-31)
- B. Rebekah wrongly instructs and aids Jacob in deceiving Isaac (5-17)
- C. Jacob deceives Isaac and receives the blessing from a leery Isaac (18-29)
- II. LEARN FROM THE TWO POSSIBLE RESPONSES WHEN THE LORD FOILS YOUR WAYS: Isaac the believer is reproved and responds in faith, while Esau the godless is sorrowful yet is unrepentant (30-40)
  - A. When Esau arrives, Isaac frightfully realizes what has happened and Esau bitterly responds (30-35)
  - B. Esau sorrowfully seeks the blessing yet is unrepentant (36-38, Heb. 12)
  - C. Isaac, having been confronted with God's sovereign will, by faith declares to Esau his fate (39-40)
- III. LET THE SAD RESULTS OF DOING THINGS ONES OWN WAY INSTRUCT YOU: As a result, Esau seeks to kill Jacob and Rebekah, deceitfully trying to protect him, sends him away never to be seen by her again (41-46)
  - A. Esau seeks to console himself by seeking to kill Jacob (41)
  - B. Rebekah seeks within her own wisdom to protect Jacob by deceitfully sending him away, thinking it will only be a few days, yet she will never see him again (42-46)
