JUDAH'S SINFUL MESS! A WARNING FOR US CONCERNING WORLDLY COMPROMISE Genesis 38:1-30

- I. WORLDLY COMPROMISE LEADS TO SINFUL CORRUPTION AND PAINFUL CONSEQUENCES: Judah's clear steps of compromise pave the way for his self-corruption and the painful and ugly consequences (1-26)
 - A. Judah leaves God's people, befriends a pagan, marries a Canaanite (1-5)
 - B. Judah's line is seemingly in jeopardy because of his evil sons and his sinful superstition (6-11)
 - 1. Judah takes a wife (Tamar) for his firstborn but his son (Er) is killed by the Lord (6-7)
 - 2. Judah commands his second son (Onan) to do his family duty but he selfishly does evil and is also killed by the Lord (8-10)
 - 3. Judah superstitiously for fear sends Tamar away to supposedly wait for his youngest son Shelah to grow up (11)
 - C. Judah's unrighteousness is further manifest through Tamar's sinful strategy and action to obtain her rightful heir (12-23)
 - 1. Judah's wife dies and he and pagan friend go up to the sheepshearers at Timnah (12)
 - 2. After some time, Tamar takes matters into her own hands and based on Judah's sinful character and compromise, she sets him up to father an heir (13-19)
 - 3. Judah sends his pagan friend to pay the cult prostitute but she is not found (20-23)
 - D. Judah hypocritical response after hearing of Tamar's pregnancy and his subsequent response after it is revealed he is the father, further manifests his sinfulness (24-26)
- II. WE ARE REASSURED THAT THE LORD WILL ACCOMPLISH HIS PURPOSES IN SPITE OF MAN'S SIN: In spite of the evil and sin of Er, Onan, Judah and Tamar, Perez is born and from his line the Messiah would come (27-30, Ruth 4, Matt 1)
