HOW ARE WE TO PRAY? Part 1 "Our Father"

Jesus reveals we are to pray in a way that which glorifies God not man Matthew 6:9

- I. Some INITIAL OBSERVATIONS concerning THE DISCIPLES PRAYER (9-13)
 - A. It is not a prayer Jesus prayed or would pray (cf 6:12, 2Cor 5.21, 1Pet 1:19, 2:22)
 - **B.** It is a general pattern with a focus, not a procedure to be followed by rote (6:8, 9)
 - C. It gives us the basic how to pray, not what to pray (cf Luke 11, Rom 8).
 - **D.** It does not give us complete revelation concerning prayer. Other biblical elements are missing, such as thankfulness (various passages).
 - **E.** It is divided in to two parts all focused on God's glory: First in relation to Him (9-10), then in relation to our needs (11-13).
 - **F.** It is given in context to how not to pray.(i.e like the unsaved, being insincere and/or ignorant) (5-8)
 - **G.** Jesus' teaching in it appears to have the goal of unveiling the deceived heart of the unforgiven who thought they were saved (cf. 6:14-15)
- II. The First half of the Prayer reveals...We are to PRAY IN A MANNER THAT GLORIFIES OUR GOD by humbly and reverently addressing Him in the context of truth about Him and His will (9-10)
 - A. Understand God is glorified when we address Him rightly as our Heavenly Father (9a)

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- B. Know God is glorified when we give the honor and reverence due His Name (9b)
- **C.** God is glorified when we anticipate and desire Christ's future return.(10a)
- **D.** God is glorified when we desire His will done now (10b)
- III. The Second half of the Prayer reveals...We are to PRAY IN A MANNER THAT GLORIFIES OUR GOD by humbly submitting our genuine needs to Him which brings Him glory (11-13)
