- III. PRAY IN A MANNER THAT GLORIFIES OUR GOD by humbly submitting our genuine needs to Him which brings Him glory (11-13)

SOME INITIAL MACRO OBSERVATIONS CONCERNING THE LORD'S (DISCIPLES) PRAYER (9-13)

- A. It is not a prayer Jesus prayed or would pray (cf 6:12, 2Cor 5.21, 1Pet 1:19, 2:22)
- **B.** It is a general pattern with a focus, not a procedure to be followed by rote (6:8, 9)
- C. It gives us the basic how to pray, not what to pray (cf Luke 11, Rom 8 NKJ).
- **D.** It does not give us complete revelation concerning prayer. Other biblical elements are missing, such as thankfulness (various passages).
- **E.** It is divided in to two parts all focused on God's glory: First in relation to Him (9-10), then in relation to our needs (11-13).
- **F.** It is given in context to how not to pray.(i.e like the unsaved, being insincere and/or ignorant) (5-8)
- **G.** Jesus' teaching in it appears to have the goal of unveiling the deceived heart of the unforgiven who thought they were saved (cf. 6:14-15)
