- II. WHY PARABLES? Jesus explains to His disciples that He speaks in parables to conceal kingdom truth from the rejecters and reveal it to the responsive (10-17)
  A. Why parables? God in in charge of who will know Kingdom truth (10-12)
  - **B. Why parables?** God conceals saving truth from those who have rejected Him, so that they would be judged, thus fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy (13-15)
    - 1. **Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled** in the response of this evil generation who is poised to be judged (13-14)
    - 2. **God conceals truth from the unrepentant** who have dulled their hearts, obstructed their ears, voluntarily blinded themselves concerning His truth (15)
  - **C.** The responsive are blessed because they can see and hear truth about Him (16-17)
