WHY DOES GOD'S KINGDOM SEEM SO SMALL?

Encouragement for true disciples and warning for rejecters Matthew 13:24-43

- I. REALIZE THE KING AND HIS KINGDOM ARE VIGOROUSLY OPPOSED: Jesus gives a parable which reveals He has an enemy, who has infiltrated His Kingdom, yet this will be dealt with at the harvest (24-30)
- II. DON'T BE DECEIVED BY THE KINGDOM'S SMALL SIZE: Jesus gives two parables which reveal His Kingdom will be the largest and permeate everything (31-33)
 - **A.** The **parable of the mustard seed**: Things aren't what they seem, the kingdom now although the smallest, will be the largest (31-32)
 - **B.** The **parable of the leaven**: Although Kingdom is small now, it will permeate everything (33)
- III. WHY PARABLES FOR THE MULTITUDES? A Reminder (34-35) cf 13:10-18
- IV. **BE ENCOURAGED** OR **BE WARNED**... AT THE END OF THE AGE CHRIST WILL PURGE HIS KINGDOM OF SATAN'S CHILDREN AND HIS TRUE CHILDREN WILL SHINE IN RIGHTEOUSNESS: Jesus explains the parable to His disciples (36-43)
 - A. Jesus gives His disciples the identity of those referred to in the parable (36-39)
 - 1. The one who sows the good seed is Jesus, the Son of man (37)
 - 2. The field is the world (38a) (not the church)
 - 3. The good seed are the spiritual children of the kingdom and thus the King (38b)
 - 4. The tares the enemy sowed are the spiritual children of the evil one (39a)
 - 5. The enemy who sowed them is the devil (39a)
 - 6. The harvest is the end of the age and the reapers are His angels (39b)
 - B. Jesus clarifies the main point of the parable: At end of the age Jesus will pull out and cast the devil's children in hell, then the righteous will shine (40-43)
 - 1. The spiritual children of the devil will be gathered out of the kingdom and cast into hell to be punished forever (40-42)
 - 2. Then the righteous will shine forth in their Fathers Kingdom (43a)
 - 3. You better listen, this is important (43b)
