HOW ARE WE TO MINISTER TO THOSE WHO ARE DIFFERENT THAN US? A lesson concerning Christ's great compassion upon anyone who seeks Him Matthew 15:29-39

- I. SOME PRELIMINARY QUESTIONS concerning the feeding of the 4000:
 - A. Is this the same event at the feeding of the 5000? No
 - B. Why would these similar, yet separate, events be recorded so closely to one another in the book of Matthew?
- II. ALLOW CHRIST'S COMPASSION TO MOVE YOU TO MEET THE SPIRITUAL NEEDS OF THOSE HE PLACES IN YOUR PATH: Christ's compassion is manifest as He ministers to the spiritual needs of the multitude of Gentiles (29-31)
 - A. Great Gentile multitudes bring to Jesus those needing healing and Jesus compassionately heals them (29-30)
 - B. The Gentile multitudes marvel and give the God of Israel the glory (31)
- III. ALLOW CHRIST'S COMPASSION TO MOVE YOU TO ALSO MEET THE PHYSICAL NEEDS OF THOSE HE PLACES IN YOUR PATH: Christ's compassion is manifest to His disciples as He also ministers to the physical needs of the Gentiles who sought Him (32-39)
 - A. Jesus reveals His compassion for the multitudes to His disciples, desiring to take care of their physical need for nourishment (32)
 - B. Jesus miraculously feeds the crowd while using the disciples their resources (33-39)
 - 1. The disciples revealed they are slow at learning spiritual lessons as are we (33)
 - 2. Jesus uses what resources they have and multiplies them, having them distribute them (34-36)
 - 3. The result was everyone's physical need for food was abundantly satisfied (37-39)
