WHAT ARE WE TO DO CONCERNING A SINNING BROTHER? JESUS REVEALS HOW HE GOES AFTER HIS STRAYING SHEEP Matt 18:11-20

- I. (REVIEW THE CONTEXT) We must RECOGNIZE HOW VALUABLE TRUE
 BELIEVERS ARE TO CHRIST AND TREAT THEM ACCORDINGLY (1-10)
- II. <u>REALIZE JESUS GOES AFTER HIS PRECIOUS SHEEP WHO STRAY</u> (SIN) (11-14)
- III. <u>UNDERSTAND HOW JESUS SEEKS THOSE WHO STRAY AND OBEY</u>: He seeks to win them through His body on earth (the Church) obeying His Word that straying sheep might be turned back and won (15-20)
 - a. EXCEPTIONS FOR WHICH SHOULD WE DO NOT APPLY MATT. 18:
 - i. We do not apply Matt. 18 for the myriad of sins that do not characterize our lives, are not continual habitual and are not out of rebellion, those that are covered by love. Instead, we apply 1Cor. 13, and 1Peter 4:8.
 - ii. We do not apply Matt. 18 for a brother that is tripped up and caught in a trespass. Instead, we apply Gal. 6:1.
 - iii. We do not apply Matt. 18 for those who are not rebellious yet are publicly disobeying. Instead, they are to be admonished, even rebuked publicly, separated from if they do not respond, and thus shamed that they might obey (Gal. 2:11-21, 1Thes. 5:14-15 and 2Thes. 3:6-15)
 - iv. We do not apply Matt. 18 for those who cause divisions, factions, and hindrances. Instead, we apply Rom. 16:17-18, Tit. 3:10-11.
 - b. HOW DO WE APPLY MATT 18, when appropriate? (15-17)
 - i. Go and reprove (expose their sin) privately to try to win them (15)
 - ii. If they do not listen, **bring one or two more witnesses** (16-17a)
 - iii. If they do not listen, **tell it to the church** (17b)
 - iv. If they do not listen, treat them as outsiders (17b-18)
 - c. Be aware of the Heavenly Authority behind the earthly process (18-20)
