HOW TO MAINTAIN UNITY IN THE CHURCH: THINKING LIKE CHRIST JESUS

Philippians 2:5-8

I. WE ARE COMMANDED TO CONTINUALLY THINK LIKE CHRIST (5)

I. THE MIND OF CHRIST IN REGARD TO OUR POSITION WITH OTHER BELIEVERS: Although existing in the form of God (He is God), Christ didn't regard His rightful equality with God a thing to be held onto, but He emptied Himself becoming like us, taking the form of a servant (one who submits to a master to do His will) (6-7)

- A. HIS EXAMPLE: Although existing in the form of God (He is God), Christ didn't regard His rightful equality with God a thing to be held onto (6)
- B. OUR APPLICATION: Looking at His example, although we are equal in Christ, we are to not think of equality with each other as something to hold onto
- C. HIS EXAMPLE: But rather **He emptied Himself** becoming like us, taking the form of a servant (one who submits to a master to do His will) **(7)**
- D. OUR APPLICATION: Thinking like Him, we are to rather become servants of God and thus each other
- II. THE MIND OF CHRIST IN REGARD TO OUR PRACTICE WITH OTHER BELIEVERS: Having been found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient, even to the point of death on the cross (8)
 - A. HIS EXAMPLE: Having been found in appearance as a man, **He humbled Himself by becoming obedient,** even to the point of death on the cross **(8)**
 - B. OUR APPLICATION: We are to humble ourselves by becoming obedient servants
