

“WHEN GOD DEPARTS”

Part 1 Ezekiel 10

- I. JUDGMENT FROM A HEAVENLY VIEWPOINT: The Glory of the Lord departs in preparation for His judgement (CH 10)**
 - A. JUDGMENT COMMANDED: The Lord of Glory commands the man in linen to bring forth His judgement (1-3)**

 - B. GOD’S GLORY IS ON THE MOVE: The Glory of the Lord leaves the cherub, and His presence begins to depart (4-5)**

 - C. GOD’S GLORY DEPARTS: A heavenly view of the undeviating execution of the command and will of God as His glory departs (6-22)**
 - 1. The Man in Linen obeys (6-8)**

 - 2. The Wheels & Cherubim described (9-17)**

 - 3. GOD’S GLORY DEPARTS from the temple: His presence departs (18-19)**

 - 4. Cherubim further described, representing the undeviating execution of the will of God (20-22)**

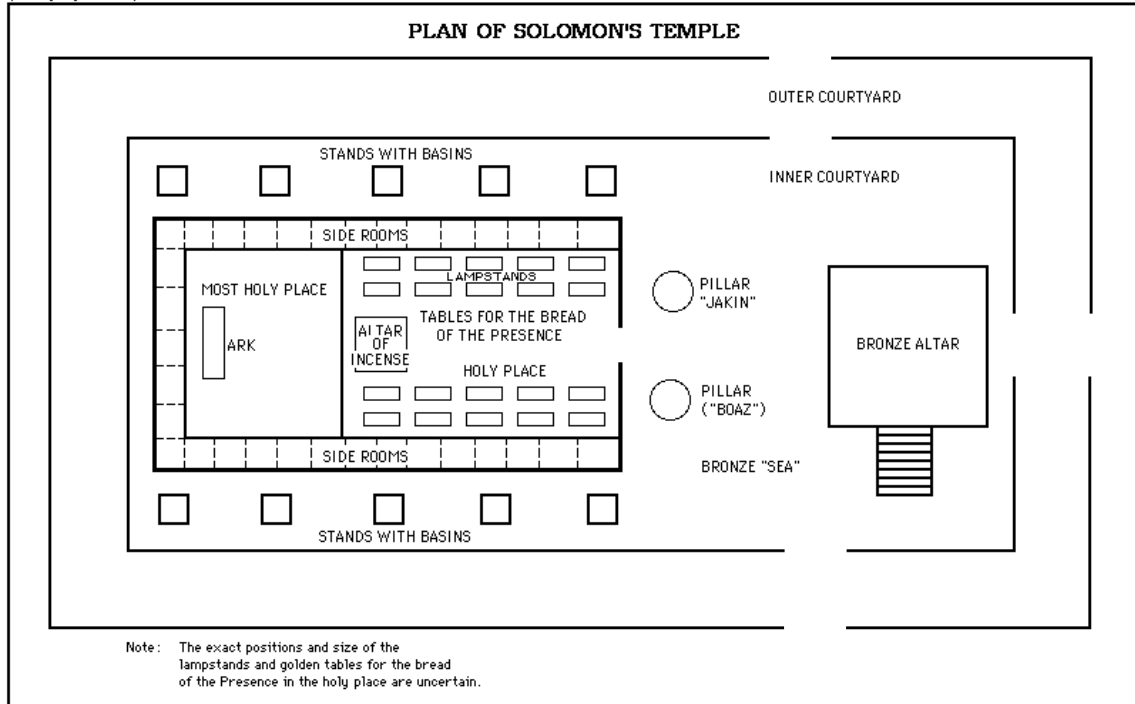
