

“JUDGMENT DAY”
EZEKIEL 24

- I. THE SIEGE HAS BEGUN THIS DAY: Jan 15th 588BC (1-2)**

- II. THE BOILING POT: Judgment has begun and will be completed (3-14)**
 - A. Boil the pot (3-5)
 - B. Woe to the bloody city: It’s filthiness will be consumed (6-11)
 - C. Because of her unwillingness to be cleansed, God’s judgment will not be stayed (12-14)

- III. EZEKIEL BECOMES A SIGN: Don’t mourn for those judged (15-27)**
 - A. Ezekiel given terrible news, yet he obeys (15-18)**
 - 1. Ezekiel is told wife will die today and He is not to publicly mourn (15-17)
 - 2. Ezekiel obeys, speaking the parable to the exiles and His wife dies (18a)
 - 3. He continues obeying, not mourning (18b)

 - B. The exiles inquiry and Ezekiel’s response (19-23)**
 - 1. Their inquiry (19)
 - 2. Ezekiel’s response: “thus says the Lord God” (20-23)
 - a) The temple, they delighted in will be destroyed (20-21a)
 - b) Their sons and daughters left behind will be slaughtered (21b)
 - c) They are not to mourn, but will rot in their sin (22-23)

 - C. Ezekiel is a sign to them: thus, they will know that He is the Lord (24-27)**
 - 1. Explained to the exiles, thus they will know that He is the Lord (24)
 - 2. Explained to Ezekiel, thus they will know that He is the Lord (25-27)
